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Punjabi Alphabet Book Gurmukhi Script

Gurmukhī (Punjabi: ਗੁਰਮੁੱਕੀ, Punjabi pronunciation: [ˈgʊrˈmʊkʰiː], Shahmukhi: گۄرۄمۄکۄگۄ) or Punjabi script is an abugida developed from the Laṅḍā scripts, standardized and used by the second Sikh guru, Guru Angad (1504–1552). Commonly regarded as a Sikh script, Gurmukhi is used in Punjab, India as the official script of the Punjabi language.

In India Punjabi is written with the Gurmukhi (ਗੁਰਮੁੱਕੀ) alphabet, while in Pakistan it is written with a version of the Urdu alphabet known as Shahmukhi (گۄرۄمۄکۄگۄ). The written standard for Punjabi in both India and Pakistan is known as Majhi (ਮੱਝੀ/مچھی), which is named after the Majha region of Punjab.
