Israel prophets had schools of prophecy, Samuel is recorded to be the father of prophetic guilds (1 Sam 19: 20) and his followers were regarded as "sons of prophets", Bishau page 41, Chapter 6, says these prophets were normally taught how to perform prophetic duties for instance prophesying ecstatically.

The prophets play a unique role in the applying of God's law in the Old Testament. There were two offices of spokesmen for God; there was the priest and the prophet. The priest was the one who was supposed to methodically and systematically and faithfully apply God's law, the Mosaic covenant, with the people of Israel.

Roles of Prophets - Thirdmill

Most of the Old Testament prophets' messages concerned the people of Israel; if other nations were mentioned in the oracles, it was usually in connection to those nations' dealings with Israel. Most prophets of God were men, but the Old Testament also mentions prophetesses such as Miriam (Exodus 15:20, ESV), Deborah (Judges 4:4, ESV), and Huldah (2 Kings 22:14, ESV).
